Lake Land College—Kathy Black reported:

- The college has a new Vice-President for Academic Services: Jim Hull.
- The college is continuing its efforts toward cultural change, adopting 5 new values: caring, communication, teamship, innovation, and excellence.
- Enrollment is down and the college is working on a strategic enrollment plan.
- The West Building addition is underway and will add 41,000 square feet to the existing 24,000 square feet structure.
- Denise Walk, IT instructor-program coordinator, joined the faculty in the fall.
- This is Janet Henry's last year and she will retire in the summer 2009.

Lincoln Trail College—Bea Abernathy reported:

• Enrollment is down about 7%, but enrollment remains strong in popular medical programs.

Olney Central College—Amie Mayhall reported:

- Enrollment is level with increases in medical programs.
- PBL has 7 students, but they are very active.

High School Reports

- Newton Community High School is in the process of revamping curriculum with plans to add more advanced classed and to move keyboarding to the junior high level.
