Josh is the Regional Manager for the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO).

Business Meeting

At 4:05 pm President Drage called the meeting to order. Shasta Bennett stated that the spring minutes were available as handouts but were also emailed to each member prior to the meeting. President Drage asked for any additions or corrections. She made a motion to accept the fall minutes; Max Estes approved the minutes and Sheryl Brummer seconded; motion carried.

Sarah Brooks, treasurer, reported a present balance of \$1,007.88. Amie Mayhall made a motion to approve the treasurer's report and Shasta Bennett seconded; motion carried.

School Reports

Clay City High School – Gina Hutton reported:

Enrollment is down.

Aren't able to add or change anything due to the low numbers.

EIU – Julie Chadd reported:

EIU currently has around 30 business education students.

More applications are coming in of students with previous business degrees but having a difficult time finding job.

Several students are doing internships this year.

Pi Omega Pi members and Phi Beta Lambda very active.

Energy Renewal Center is being built.

Oblong High School – Amy Tarr reported:

The school added 5 more Mac's to their lab and are supposed to receive more soon.

Will have a total of 45 total portable Mac's in the school.

Enrollment is up slightly.

Olney Central College – Amie Mayhall reported:

Enrollment is up 18%. There are 82 students in the MOA program. Main cause of this is from dislocated workers, TAA, etc.

Robinson High School--Tanya Pfeiffer reported:

Enrollment numbers aren't too bad due to the freshmen requirement of a business course.

They are not adding any more classes to the curriculum; did add accounting previously but flip-flopped several other computer classes.

They offer Twin Rivers grants with MOS Certification.

Enrollment is steady but strong.

Lisa Jobe is coordinating Office Technology; Kathy Daugherty doing Medical Office.

Lincoln Trail College – Linda Branch reported:

Enrollment is up.

Bea Abernathy is very busy due to the increase in enrollment.

Purchase of a building was approved, but state hasn't come up with any money yet.

Newton Community High School—Sheryl Brummer reported:

Stated there were no big changes.

Still have 3 Business teachers.

Co-op's numbers are up.

Computer Concepts is required so numbers are strong.

Web Design courses are popular and numbers up in it.
