School Reports

Eastern Illinois University—Julie Chadd reported:

- The Phi Beta Lambda Chapter currently has ten members. The chapter is working on its first social and community service projects.
- The Pi Omgea Pi chapter placed 9th in national competition last year.
- The number of business education students is still low this year. If you have a student in your classes that you feel would be a great business teacher, be sure to mention this to him/her. Students often don't think about teaching business as a career choice.
